

A Study of the General Epistles

(NT Survey Lesson 225-Revelation 11)

Introduction: As the trumpets are sounded we are given a progressive revelation of the wrath of God against his enemies. However, little has been said about who these enemies are. Chapter eleven helps us with a determination of how God's people fit into the drama unfolding before us.

Lesson aim: To seek to understand the significance of the two witnesses.

The two witnesses--Rev. 11:1-14

1. What does John say was given to him? What was he instructed to do with it? What was John instructed not to measure?
2. Whom did God say he would grant his two witnesses to do? How long would they prophesy?
3. How are the witnesses described in v. 4?
4. What happens to those who desire to harm them? What are they able to do? (v. 6)
5. What happens to the two witnesses after they have finished their testimony? Who is responsible for their death?
6. How is the city described in which the dead bodies of the witnesses lie?
7. How do those from peoples, tribes, tongues and nations respond to their death?
8. What happens after three and a half days? What happens to the two witnesses?
9. What happens in the city after the two witnesses are called to heaven? How do the people of the city react?

The seventh trumpet--Rev. 11:15-19

1. What did the voices in heaven declare at the sounding of the seventh trumpet?
2. What do the twenty-four elders declare that God has done? What do they say in v. 18 has occurred?
